Dear Parishioners - Celebrating our Parish Feast Day Our Parish Patron saint, Paul of the Cross, founded the Congregation of the Passion 300 years ago next month. Thus, we will soon be celebrating a Jubilee Year across the world and as a Passionist parish we will be able to share in some of the events and initiatives planned for next year.

However today as we celebrate the Feast of St Paul of the Cross, I thought that it might be of interest to learn a little more about our Congregation in its global setting. From our small beginnings in Italy in 1720 we are now located in sixty-three countries across the world and number around 1.900 members.

Perhaps it is also helpful to see our Congregation in a wider setting of the Church today. While the Passionists have grown steadily over the course of our 300 years, the Church itself has had amazing growth particularly over the past 120 years. In 1900, 75% of the world's Catholics lived in Europe or the USA; today this is reversed, and more than two thirds of Catholics now live in the southern hemisphere. This growth will continue throughout our lifetimes to the extent that by 2050, 80% of the world's Catholics will be African, Asian, or Hispanic.

Our Congregation is also part of this enormous shift from the Northern Hemisphere to the Southern Hemisphere. Today almost all our younger members are from Asia, Africa, or Latin America, and like other Congregations this is our future, because nearly all our vocations are also in these same continents. To be even more precise, our growth today is in the world's equatorial and tropical regions.

In many places within the western world it seems the Church is experiencing a time of diminishment (and marginalisation) and sadly a time where we have so few vocations, but globally Christianity is not in decline. It is growing and renewing itself. Our Congregation may be described in the same way - we do face diminishment (and aging) in some areas of the western world, and yet we experience significant growth in other parts of the world and we are renewing ourselves.

Our life as a religious Congregation might also be described in an image - that of a spider's web. We are centred on the passion, death, and resurrection of Jesus and all our pastoral responses radiate out from this central Charism. Just as a web has separate but interconnected strands, so too with our mission in various countries. We are one, but we are many, and while each part of our Congregation adapts to the local cultures, we remain deeply connected by a common Charism. This makes it possible for the whole Congregation to witness and live in the same spirit.

Our community at St. Paul's is a good example of the reality of Passionist life today. We are men from Papua New Guinea, Tanzania, Canada, China, Vietnam, and Australia and yet we live the same Charism in the one community.

I extend a special greeting also to our Sisters today – members of an autonomous order the *Passionist Sisters* of St Paul of the Cross who share with us the Passionist Charism.

And to you dear parishioners, Happy Parish Feast day greetings to each of you.
