



Dear Parents/Caregivers, Students, Staff and Friends of St Raphael's School,

Yesterday, Student Voice led an initiative, 'Show your True Colours' and invited students and staff to wear their favourite sporting colours in exchange for providing a gold coin to a charitable cause. We raised \$152 and this money will be donated to MercyWorks, an organisation that supports disadvantaged communities. Our school takes its charism, of compassion, love, and mercy from Catherine McAuley, the founder of the Mercy Sisters. Our school was also founded by the Mercy sisters one hundred and thirty one years ago. We have a proud history of supporting those in our communities who need our help.

On Friday 25 September, we celebrate Mercy Day, a day where we traditionally remember Catherine McAuley and the outreach the Mercy Sisters living today provide various communities both in Australia and globally. Our celebration begins with a Liturgy at 10:15 am followed by activities led by our senior Year 6 leaders, weather permitting. Activity stations have been organised to reflect key points in Catherine McAuley's life and students along with their teachers have an opportunity to interact within these activities. This year is different as we are not asking our community to provide additional donations towards this cause, because money raised by Student Voice initiatives this past week, as well as funds raised at the school disco, will be donated to MercyWorks. We thank you for your generosity in supporting us.

As we end our school term, I commend our third instalment of the *Celebrating Learning Newsletter* to you. It details some of the excellent learning our students have participated in during Term 3.

I remind families that students wear their full summer uniform next term, and due to the uncertainty of the weather, students may continue to wear their winter uniform for the first two weeks of term.

We are very fortunate that Fr Denis is taking a very 'hands on' role as our Parish Priest. This term he has spent time with each of the classes leading them on a tour of the church and answering their questions. The Year 3 and Year 4 class have spent the term learning about the parts of the Mass and they welcomed Fr Denis into their classroom to answer their questions. There were several comments appreciating the way Fr Denis presented his information:

Stained glass windows were put in churches because people could not read and this was a way they could learn about the message in the Bible. (Luella)

The bread (which becomes the body of Jesus after the special prayers by the priest) is kept in the tabernacle and this can be taken and given to people who are not able to attend Mass (Loraine)

It is wonderful that our students have this rich opportunity to pose questions and reflect of these important aspects of their faith.

From the Director of Learning



The Learning Zone – where improvement happens!

In Australia the goal for education is that all young Australians become conï¬dent and creative individuals, successful lifelong learners, and active and informed members of the community.

In Catholic Education South Australia our goal is that all young people are thriving people, capable learners and leaders for the world God desires.

With these goals at the forefront of what we do every day at St Raphael's School, we aim to make sure our school is the ultimate 'learning zone'.

Teachers have recently been considering this TED Talk by Eduardo Briceno, Co-Founder of Mindset Works who presents the idea of the importance of Learning Zones and Performance Zone and how each are useful for learning. The Performance Zone is where we put into action what we have learnt, but the Learning Zone is all about improvement. In this space we can experiment and make mistakes and learn from them in a low-risk/low-stakes environment.

As a part of our Visible Learning Project we are developing a shared language of learning across the school. The development of our Learner Dispositions (resilience, curiosity, thinking, taking responsibility and collaborating) will contribute significantly to this goal.

At St Raphael's School we are changing our language with our learners – consciously speaking of 'learning' rather than 'work'. We are also using the language of 'yet' to help our learners to have a growth mindset rather than a closed mindset about their learning. This could certainly be something you can use at home. When you hear your children say things like 'I can't do that' or 'I don't understand' help them to add in the word 'yet'. This simple change helps them (and us!) to acknowledge their potential to learn and be open to growing their skills and understanding. This helps our learners to get into the Learning Zone!

Learning in Miss Rowson's Reception Year 1 Class

Throughout Term 3 the Reception and Year One students have been using their learning powers when engaging in activities across the curriculum.

In Mathematics, the students engaged in making fractions and in Visual Arts they created a paper pizza to demonstrate their learning and understanding. The students cut their whole pizza into halves and/or quarters. The students then moved their learning focus to money. The student's role-played shops using pretend money to consolidate their understanding. We are all wondering if notes and coins soon become the thing of the past? Hmmm a great wonder question.

In Health, the students continue to practice personal and social skills to interact positively with others. As a collective group they identified and described emotional responses that they may experience in different situations and worked through a process of how they can get help. We have spoken about our mind being like a pond with all the emotions being like fish swimming around. The main goal is to keep your mind a calm pond, not becoming a certain fish (emotion). When a fish pops up, such as an angry fish, it is important to acknowledge

that fish and let it swim back into the pond which is your mind and to regain a calm pond once again. The students have been learning about the importance of relationships and as a class we used the story 'The Rainbow Fish' as a resource. To celebrate Book Week, we used the message from this story for multiple activities, and we thought it was fitting to create a colourful fish for our costume to wear at the parade. The students made their own colourful paper fish during Visual Arts lessons.
