Thank you to all families who are scanning in the QR codes when entering the school grounds. Detailed below is some information from the Commonwealth Department of Health for parents/caregivers to consider.

- COVID-19 vaccines are free and voluntary for everyone living in Australia.
- Some previous government advice indicated there were some visa categories excluded from the free COVID‹19 vaccine eligibility. The updated advice from the Commonwealth Government indicates that there are no visas excluded.
- The Australian Government will provide COVID-19 vaccinations free to everyone living in Australia, including refugees, asylum seekers, temporary protection visa holders, and those on bridging visas. People currently residing in detention facilities will also be eligible, including those whose visas have been cancelled.
- More translated information about COVID-19 vaccines is available on the Commonwealth Government Department of Health website. It includes:

 - Information on what to expect after your vaccine
 - How to prepare for COVID-19 vaccination
 - The COVID-19 consent form



Language of learning

Over the past year our focus has been on increasing our language of learning at St Raphael's School. We are making a shift to ensure our students know what they are learning – not just what they are doing. This helps our learners to make sense of and take ownership of their learning. Teachers are sharing learning intentions with the students from the curriculum. They are also working with learners to help them identify what success looks like in relation to this learning. This way, students can know what they are aiming for and how they are progressing in relation to the learning. Mia and I are engaging in 'learning walks' regularly and asking the following questions of the learners:

What are you learning?
How are you going?
How do you know?
How can you improve?
Where can you go for help?

Ask your child about the learning intentions and success criteria of their learning at school. You might also like to ask the above questions and help them build their language of learning.


